Message From the Mayor

I was re-elected in May to serve as your Town Mayor for an additional year as well as a Town Councillor for the ensuing four years.

This year has been extremely hectic. First of all, I want to express my gratitude to our town for its support during the coronation ceremonies, which united the neighbourhood through happy and sorrowful times.

We have a very busy few months ahead of us, so we are grateful that Mr Michael Greenfield, our new clerk, joined us in April this year and will once again have a town clerk on a full-time basis. Many of the projects we had begun and hoped to begin are now moving forward. I'm eager to start the town's improvements and enhancements in the upcoming year.

In a highly challenging environment, budget planning is currently underway. Making decisions for the upcoming fiscal year is extremely difficult because no one could have anticipated the effects of the cost of living issue on us at this time last vear.

With the help of our consultants our NDP working party is reviewing the neighbourhood development plan for our town and is making great progress. We are currently constructing our sensory garden in Bathurst Park, a proposal that was presented to the

council when I first became a councillor over two and a half years ago. It is wonderful to see the efforts and talents of our grounds team. We are eagerly anticipating the garden's completion by the spring of 2024.

We will hold our yearly fireworks display in Bathurst Park on Friday, 3rd November. To honour and commemorate our nation's fallen service members and women, we are also busy arranging our communities' Remembrance parade for Sunday, 12th November with the help and advice from the Lydney Royal British Legion. Before we know it, Christmas will be here. We'll be hosting a parade and ceremony on December 1st to celebrate, along with other festive events that are still in the planning stage.

We are still searching for new members to join the Lydney Town Council. There are several seats up for co-option. If you want to make a difference, volunteer your time for the numerous projects of community involvement and regeneration, as well as for the enhancement of the amenities and environment in which we live. We'd be thrilled to hear from you.

In the name of all my council members, I'd want to express my gratitude to our community for the support and encouragement you provide for the role we play for Lydney.



D-Day 80 Beacon

Lydney Town Council has resolved to light a beacon on Primrose Hill in celebration of D-Day 80. The event is a celebration and commemoration of this important occasion, as well as using the event to enable communities and individuals to pay their tribute to those who gave so much during this campaign to help ensure the freedom we all enjoy today. The flames from the Beacons will represent the 'light of peace' that emerged from the dreadful darkness of war all those years ago.

The coordinated events will aim to have the beacons lit at 9:15 pm on 6th June 2024.

Community Event 22nd July

The community reaffirmed on Saturday 22nd July that they would enjoy any weather conditions despite the dampness and rain. The community showed up to the event with gazebos, umbrellas, raincoats, and good spirits. The event was supported by various musical acts, emergency services, a funfair, Balloon Man, children's sensory play, voluntary and community groups and an array of stall holders.

Civility and Respect Pledge

At the Council meeting held on Monday 11th September 2023, Lydney Town Council resolved to sign up for the Civility and Respect Pledge.

The National Pledge has been organised by The National Association of Local Councils (NALC), One Voice Wales, the Society of Local Council Clerks (SLCC) and county associations that will oversee the Civility and Respect Project.

By signing the Pledge, Lydney Town Council agreed that the council would treat councillors, clerks, employees, members of the public and representatives of partner organisations and volunteers with civility and respect.

And that it:

- Has put in place a training programme for councillors and staff
- Has signed up to the Code of Conduct for councillors
- Has good governance arrangements in place including staff contracts and a dignity-at-work policy
- Will seek professional help at the early stages should civility and respect issues arise
- Will commit to calling out bullying and harassment if and when it happens
- Will continue to learn from best practices in the sector and aspire to be a role model/ champion council through for example the local Council Award Scheme
- Supports the continued lobbying for change in legislation to support the Civility and Respect
 Pledge including sanctions for elected
 members where appropriate

Could we help your organisation with a grant?

The Council is committed to supporting and strengthening the many networks and community groups that help to make a positive difference to Lydney.

Every year we put aside money in our Budget to assist community organisations and we have increased the maximum sum available to any one group from £500 to £1,000.

Lydney Town Council's grant policy aims to: -

- Support projects and initiatives which will directly benefit the residents of Lydney.
- Enable local people to participate in voluntary groups, organisations and activities
- Help the town's voluntary groups and organisations to improve effectiveness.

• To support organisations which meet the needs of the people experiencing social and economic difficulties.

• To ensure that there is equality of access for Lydney residents to the services it provides and funds.

• To enable the local community to be involved with and participate in local sports clubs/ organisations.



Applicants must be based in the Lydney area and be non-profit making.

Accounts must be provided to the Council.

Grants cannot be used to pay for salaries or support core costs. Applicants with considerable turnover or reserves are likely to be unsuccessful.

We are inviting applications for the next tranche of grants to be considered on Monday 6th November 2023.


18th November
