5.1 Highways Transport correspondence

Communication from GCC, Highways Department, relating to the ongoing issue of water running from Driffield junction down Highfield Hill. Despite cleaning earlier this year, some chambers have jammed lids, there will be an attempt to unjam and a further clean. CCTV jetting has identified a possible new route to send some of the water, if a new route can be lay this is likely to be undertaken in March/April. Cllr Preest has escalated this situation to GCC Highways Director.
