# **MAYOR'S CADETS**

The Mayor's Cadet Scheme, established in 2009 by former Mayor Councillor Martin Bowring, continues to honour exemplary young leaders from Lydney's vibrant youth organisations. Each year, this prestigious appointment celebrates individuals who have demonstrated exceptional dedication and leadership within their respective cadet units. On Monday 9th June 2025, Lydney Town Council announced the appointment of two outstanding individuals to the role of Mayor Cadet:

### 1. CADET SERGEANT THEODORE HAWKRIDGE

His ambition is to join the RAF and therefore like many young people joined the appropriate cadet service to gain knowledge and experience of the potential discipline and behaviour expected by the Armed Forces. Hawkridge has shown considerable determination to reach these expectations.

During the almost four years as a cadet at 614 (Lydney) Squadron he has shown a high level of interest and dedication to his ambition.

He is keen to learn as much as possible about the RAF Air Cadets and has progressed through the classifications at a considerable rate reaching the classification of Master Cadet in under four years and the rank of Cdt Sgt in just over three years.

### 2. ABLE CADET RHYS JONES

Rhys is a young man who has demonstrated exceptional personal growth and development during his time with the Sea Cadets. His confidence has grown significantly, and he has matured into a capable young leader who is both respected by his peers and admired by younger cadets.

Rhys consistently shows a willingness to step outside of his comfort zone and approach new challenges with a positive attitude. His enthusiasm and commitment to the Sea Cadets are evident in everything he does—from his pride in wearing the uniform to his dedication to upholding the values of the corps.

# **DRAINAGE WORK**

Gloucestershire County Council, with the assistance of GCC Highways and Forest of Dean District Council, has been working to clear a culvert located on East Marsh opposite Lydney Recreation Trust. This important work is part of ongoing efforts to address local drainage issues.

It is hoped that the clearance of the culvert will help to alleviate the flooding that has affected Lakeside and the Recreation Trust land in recent years. This collaborative project demonstrates the continued commitment of local authorities to improving flood resilience and protecting our community spaces.


